How to mark or highlight text

Standard Windows Keys: Shift + arrow *OR* Eclipse command F7 *OR* Eclipse hyperkey M. The Eclipse commands may be repeated or used in conjunction with the arrow keys. Eclipse uses the term *mark block* for marking or selecting a block of text. The "esc" key unselects or unmarks the text.

How to copy text

Standard Windows Keys: CTRL + C
