- Stenographers are the most technologically advanced, highly trained individuals for creating a written record.
- A stenographic record is the most accurate, reliable, and secure method available.
- When a transcript is needed, a single stenographic court reporter can immediately provide what it can take four or five digital transcriptionists to produce using a standard QWERTY keyboard.
- Stenographic reporting requires two years of specialized training and testing, as well as the completion of an internship.
- Additional certifications through the National Court Reporters Association and state associations give further assurances to consumers that they have hired a qualified court reporter.
- Stenographic court reporters assure that the record is verifiable as it happens, not after the fact.

Problems with digital recordings

- ◆ The market readiness of automated speech recognition (ASR) is overhyped. Did the witness say "bologna amputation" or "below-knee amputation"? A live court reporter's constant brain processing works more efficiently than any computer software can and ensures an accurate record.
- Artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning software claim a 99% accurate transcript in a controlled environment. The reality is that these accuracy rates plummet in uncontrolled instances, such as during a courtroom proceeding.
- The same dangers that exist with digital reporting also apply to AI/ASR because unregulated transcriptionists fill in the gaps where the technology falls short.

Your notice of deposition should indicate that the testimony will be taken before a stenographic court reporter. Your client, your case, and your records are too important to risk to substandard alternatives.
